

ORDINANCE NO. 93-2
OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
OF LAPORTE COUNTY, INDIANA

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 89-6
TO INCLUDE REPRESENTATION OF THE GENERAL
AND EDUCATIONAL COMMUNITIES ON THE
JUVENILE SERVICES BOARD

WHEREAS, this body's intent in creating the Juvenile Services Board was to create a board whose members would fully represent the views of various well-defined entities.

WHEREAS, this body has reaffirmed its original intent that representatives sitting on the Juvenile Board must be elected from or selected from the entities they represent, and

WHEREAS, on further review of the ordinance and after obtaining input from members of the community, it appears that the five entities currently represented on the Board, namely County Commission, Council, Judiciary, Sheriff's Department and Prosecutor's Office while playing a vital and integral role, do not fully represent the spectrum of the community segments that play a role in the juvenile services system, and

WHEREAS, both the educational and general public play a vital role in juvenile services issues and deserve a full voice, indeed a full voting and participating representative on said Juvenile Services Board.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that Ordinance No. 89-6 is hereby amended:

Section 1. Section 3 of said Ordinance is amended to read: "The LaPorte County Juvenile Services Board shall consist of seven members."

Section 2. An additional sentence shall be added at the conclusion of Sentence 3. Said sentence shall read: "In addition to the foregoing five (5) members who shall be appointed by and from within the entities they represent, the Board of Commissioners shall appoint both one (1) representative from the educational community in LaPorte County and one (1) representative from the general community of LaPorte County at large who have evidenced an interest in Juvenile Services issues."

Section 3. This amendment shall be in full force and effect upon passage and approval.
